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1. Introduction

The City of Perry's Brownfields Program will identify potential hazards, prepare for remediation, and create new redevelopment opportunities within the City. To encourage investment, the program will support environmental assessment and technical assistance.

Through U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Community-Wide Brownfield Assessment funding, the brownfields program will provide predevelopment resources to encourage community-based projects that will serve as a catalyst to promote brownfield site redevelopment, affordable/workforce housing, and open/green space projects. The City received \$375,000 for this initiative from the EPA.



This Community Involvement Plan (CIP) will describe the methods the City of Perry's Brownfields Program will utilize for community about program activities. The CIP will serve as a roadman in er

The CIP will serve as a roadmap in engaging and educating stakeholders, citizens, and private investment entities to achieve redevelopment plans with community buy-in and based on common community goals. To meet the needs of the community, the City has identified the following actions:

- Host up to five public open house events (in person and/or virtually).
- Publish open house events in several outlets (local organizations, media, etc.).
- Develop a dedicated Perry Brownfields Program website.
- Develop and maintain a program specific brochure.
- Update the City Council on program activities.
- Mailings may be sent to area residents, businesses, organizations, and property owners as needed.
- Maintain a depository of all technical reports.
- Post meeting notices in public facilities and community locations:

2. Background

The City of Perry is located in central lowa within Dallas County. Perry has a population of 7,660 (2020 Census) and is predominantly characterized by white (62%) and Latino (32%) populations.

Perry first developed around the Rock Island and Milwaukee railroads and grew as an industrial and commercial producer. As the rail lines were phased out in the 1970s, the town's economy faltered and underutilized sites became more prevalent.

Perry currently has an estimated total of 209 brownfields facilities (according to the Platform for Exploring Environmental Records), including twenty vacant and underutilized sites along the former rail lines and adjacent to residential homes. Over 70% of the housing within Perry was built prior to 1960. Children and senior citizens make up 37 percent of the population in Perry, and both groups have nearly double the rate of low-income persons than national and state averages.

This brownfield community-wide assessment grant will help the City determine environmental conditions, conduct and prioritize an inventory of brownfield sites, develop cleanup plans, and complete an areawide redevelopment plan. This will allow contamination from brownfield sites, which present a serious risk to sensitives populations and exacerbate economic challenges in the area, to be mitigated and set the groundwork for revitalization.





3. Program Description

This brownfields program will allow the City of Perry to determine environmental conditions of brownfield sites across the community. A comprehensive field inventory of potential brownfield sites will be conducted as part of the site investigation component of this program. An estimated fifteen (15) Phase I Environmental Site Assessment (ESAs), four (4) Phase II ESAs, four (4) supplemental Phase II ESAs, which will inspect for asbestos-containing materials (ACM) and/or lead-based paint (LBP) hazards, and three (3) site-specific cleanup plans will be completed.

Additionally, this program includes developing an area-wide redevelopment plan for the City of Perry. Components of the area-wide plan could include land use assessment, infrastructure evaluation, revitalization planning, community health assessment, evaluation of market viability, market study, resource road mapping, site disposition strategies, site reuse assessment, and reuse visioning.

The City of Perry selected Impact7G, Inc (Impact7G) as the Qualified Environmental Professional (QEP) for assistance with this grant after a public Request for Qualifications (RFQ) process.

The program supports the following activities related to brownfield redevelopment:

- Task 1: Cooperative Agreement Oversight. This task includes general administration of the grant and will be completed by both the City and Impact7G.
- Task 2: Community Outreach. This task includes all activities related to involving the public and key stakeholders in the grant as recommended by this plan.
- Task 3: Site Work. Site work includes completion of the ESAs as noted above. As the QEP for this project, Impact7G's environmental specialists will lead inspections and utilize certified laboratories for hazardous materials testing.
- Task 4: Planning. As detailed above, this task will identify a long-range plan for the City and community leaders
 to follow as future sites are considered for brownfields redevelopment. Planning will be led by Impact7G.

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4. Key Stakeholders

Through this CIP, stakeholders in the community will be provided a venue for participation in the project through a two-way communication system. Members of the community will gain knowledge of Perry's Brownfields Program activities and the redevelopment process. This CIP will help ensure that the communication process is ongoing and project information is available as key project components are initiated and completed.

Through the grant application and planning process, several stakeholders and community supporters have been identified as integral in the implementation of the EPA Brownfields grant awarded to the City. As the City embarks on assessment and planning activities, these longstanding stakeholders and partnerships at the local, state, and federal levels will be engaged as the project progresses and will provide input as opportunities arise.
